Guidance for Municipalities Utilizing the Special Municipal Tax Option Available Under Act 205 for Distressed Pension Plans

A variety of recovery remedies are set forth in Act 205 that "shall be available to municipalities based on the extent of financial distress of the municipal pension system" determined by the Pennsylvania Employer Retirement Commission ("PERC"). 53 P.S. § 895.602. As many of you know, PERC was subsequently abolished and its duties transferred to the Municipal Pension Reporting Program in the Department of the Auditor General pursuant to Act 100 of 2016. Act 205 outlines recovery remedies for minimally distressed municipal pension systems (Level I of the recovery program); moderately distressed municipal pension systems (Level II of the recovery program); and severely distressed municipal pension systems (Level III of the recovery program). 53 P.S. § 895.602. Distress levels are based on funding ratio and a related scoring system set forth at 53 P.S. § 895.503. It should be noted, however, that Act 205 also indicates that if the municipality elects to utilize the remedy of increasing earned income or real estate property tax rates above the maximum amounts that would otherwise apply, that municipality "shall not reduce the level of municipal contributions to the pension plans prior to the implementation of the special municipal taxing authority." 53 P.S. § 895.607 (f)(1). Recently, the Department of Auditor General has audited municipalities taking advantage of the special taxing authority in a manner inconsistent with the statute. Specifically, the Department has advised that municipalities may not use the revenue to reduce or replace state pension aid or general fund contributions to pay municipal pension debt. As a courtesy, we are reminding our members that the purpose of the special municipal tax is to provide additional funding for the municipalities' distressed pension plans and that such municipalities should rely on actuarial guidance to understand precisely what is owed and from where the money must come.
