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PA Legislature Turns Its Attention to Police Reform

The General Assembly turned its attention to police reform bills this week. As we did with the COVID-19 legislation, we are keeping <u>a chart of police reform bills</u> for members to access on our website. Many of the bills on the chart were introduced early in the session and are now being revisited. Legislators are also putting out new co-sponsorship memos and filing new bills. On Monday, June 15, the House Judiciary Committee met to consider two bills which were amended and voted out of Committee unanimously. Please see House Bills 1841 and 1910 on the chart. Among other things, these bills deal with police training, regular mental health evaluations for police, updated hiring practices for police and the development of a database to hold information on police officers with prior criminal and disciplinary actions against them. We will have more on the police reform measures being considered in the Legislative Locator at the end of the month.
