The League's 2021 Legislative Priorities

The League has updated its Legislative Priorities to address the most pressing issues for our members as the 2021/2022 legislative session begins. The <u>2021 Legislative Priorities</u> will serve as the top issues for our advocacy efforts in the next year.

While several priorities, such as public safety pensions, the tax-exempt burden and local control issues remain the same, we have updated others and added one new priority – the repeal of consumer fireworks. As you are well aware, consumer fireworks legalization has resulted in a very expensive unfunded mandate. It has been detrimental to the quality of life of Pennsylvanians and very difficult to enforce. For this reason, The League is prioritizing the repeal of the consumer fireworks law, Act 43 of 2017.

Updates include an addition to the collective bargaining priority highlighting the need for neutral arbitrator accountability; and the need to amend Act 111 in order to ensure lasting police reform. And last, but not least, the need for direct and targeted investment in our communities is a top priority in order for localities to recover, and for them to help their residents and small businesses recover, from the unforeseen economic devastation caused by the pandemic.


