

Message from PennPRIME Insurance Trusts — The Department of Labor & Industry (DLI) requires Pennsylvania employers to post certain notices for their employees about applicable labor laws. Organizations can be fined up to \$25,000 for not doing so. According to DLI, "All notices must be posted in a conspicuous place so they can be seen and read by employees." The American Rescue Plan Implementation Update — Last week, the U.S. Department of Treasury <u>laid out</u> the steps that metropolitan cities and non-entitlement units of local government need to take to receive their grants from the American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA). The National League of Cities (NLC) is here to answer questions and support your responsible stewardship of these critical funding opportunities with tools and guidance.

Congratulations to The Greater Easton Development Partnership (GEDP) which was awarded third place in the nation for the Shop Small 'Order In, Help Out' Innovation Challenge by America Express and the National Main Street Center.

Spring has sprung, and cities and utilities are beginning to plan infrastructure improvements with the warmer weather approaching. <u>U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigleg Announces Availability of \$1 Billion to Modernize and Create New American Infrastructure</u> — The U.S. DOT published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to apply for \$1 billion in Fiscal Year 2021 discretionary grant funding through the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grants. RAISE has awarded over \$8.935 billion in grants to projects since 2009.

<u>Bells Across Pennsylvania – 2021</u> — "Bells Across Pennsylvania" is being observed on the first Sunday in May, which is May 2, 2021, a municipal event whose purpose is to recognize first responders and others who have enabled Pennsylvania to prevail against the pandemic.

Advance Education Brochure on Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) — The EBB is administered by Universal Service Corporation (USAC) on behalf of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The FCC is charged with distributing \$3.2B in EBB assistance directly to eligible consumers through Internet Service Providers (ISPs).

The U.S. Census Bureau is beginning its Census of Governments outreach and promotion effort and they need your help to increase awareness, participation, and response rates. The Census Bureau conducts a Census of Governments of all state and local government organization units every five years, for years ending in two and seven, as required by law under Title 13, U.S. Code, Section 161. The collection of this data will be part of a three-phase effort to document the size, structure, and finances of all state and local governments.
