General Assembly Ends the COVID Emergency Declaration

During the May 18th primary election, a majority of Pennsylvanians voted to approve two constitutional amendments curbing gubernatorial powers regarding disaster emergency declarations.

The first constitutional amendment limits emergency declarations to 21 days, and the second provides the General Assembly with the sole authority to extend or end an emergency declaration with a simple majority vote.

With this new constitutional authority, Majority Leader Kerry Benninghoff introduced <u>House Resolution</u> <u>106</u> to terminate a part of the emergency declaration declared by Governor Wolf on March 6, 2020. The bill moved swiftly through the House, and during consideration on the House floor, an amendment was adopted to completely and immediately terminate the emergency declaration. On June 8, the House voted to adopt the resolution in a party line 113 to 90 vote.

The General Assembly stayed in Harrisburg an additional day and the Senate adopted the resolution in a party line 30-20 vote on June 10. As a concurrent resolution, it does not need the Governor's approval as long as both chambers of the General Assembly approve the resolution. Therefore, the disaster emergency declaration has been terminated as of June 10, 2021.

Additionally, <u>House Bill 854</u>, passed by both Chambers and signed by the Governor, represents a compromise that allows for the continued suspension of certain Commonwealth business and agency regulations that were originally suspended by the COVID emergency declaration. These regulation waivers, which mainly concern healthcare, are extended until September 30.

In terms of an impact on local government, the termination of the emergency declaration means local governing bodies must return to in-person meetings immediately. As the municipal codes differ, please consult your solicitor when making decisions regarding the transition.


