## Take Action: Now is the Time for the House to Pass Local Use of Radar

With just weeks left in the legislative session and with a new momentum within the General Assembly, now is the time to keep the pressure on the PA House to pass local use of radar.

The League joined the PA Radar Coalition for a Local Use of Radar Rally at the Capitol on the morning of June 9, where many League members were in attendance. Additionally, there was a substantial law enforcement presence, including the State Police, in support of bringing the House Bill 606 to the Floor for a final vote before summer recess. With both the increase of speed-related fatalities in Pennsylvania and the dwindling number of nonradar speed timing devices, the "perfect storm" public safety crisis looms over the Commonwealth. In 2022, it is time we trust our municipal police with radar. The General Assembly must act to authorize the local use of radar.

House Bill 606 has been stalled in the House Appropriations Committee for over a year. Support our advocacy efforts by sending a letter to your Representative today requesting that they ask House Leadership to move House Bill 606 to the Floor for a final vote.

### PennDOT Automated Vehicles Survey

At the direction of the Highly Automated Vehicle Advisory Committee, PennDOT just kicked off the development of an AV Municipal Guidebook. The goal of the guidebook is to educate municipalities, direct them to additional resources, and make recommendations about explicit actions they can take to develop a better institutional understanding of and preparedness for AVs.

The Guidebook will cover:

- Pennsylvania's Automated Future
- Why You Should Care
- Considerations for Municipalities (e.g., Public/Community Concerns, Safety and Security, Risk Mitigation, Operations, Policy, Planning, Infrastructure Investments, and Workforce/Staffing)
- Opportunities (e.g., Education and Engagement, Partnerships, and Programs and Funding)
- Recommended Actions Table
- Next Steps

The first step of the project is to issue a survey to all municipalities, county governments, and MPOs/RPOs to assess what topics/items should be included in the Guidebook.

### The deadline to complete the survey is Friday, June 24.

Sustainable Pennsylvania is an online, voluntary recognition program for municipalities to assess their performance on topics critical to good governance. To date, 120 municipalities throughout Pennsylvania have earned certification, and they are home to more than 3.4 million residents across the state. Incorporating sustainability policies and practices benefits government operations, fosters community economic development, and leads to a resilient, attractive community. Participating municipalities will explore questions such as:

- Does the community have an updated comprehensive plan that includes energy efficiency, transportation access, or stormwater quality recommendations?
- Has the community completed an energy audit or greenhouse gas inventory?
- Does the municipality have a policy to ensure underrepresented groups are recruited for employment?

Municipalities earn points based on their responses to questions, and can earn Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Platinum certification. The League and Sustainable Pittsburgh have built numerous tools and resources that municipalities can access through participation in this free program. Municipalities that earn certification are recognized on the Sustainable PA website and participation in the program is considered by the DCED in its municipal funding applications. Sustainable Pennsylvania's municipal certification provides communities clear and recognizable objectives to share.
