Legislation to Watch This Fall

The General Assembly will return to Harrisburg next month in what will be a busy fall before the end of the 2021/22 legislative session. With just a handful of legislative session days scheduled and an election looming, members of the General Assembly are under pressure to move legislation.

The League's Governmental Affairs staff continues to monitor bills of importance to local government. The three bills below have the potential to move this fall, and they would have a detrimental impact by placing unfunded mandates on local government and by preempting local permitting and zoning authority.

- Senate Bill 669 introduced by Senator Mike Regan, would require municipalities to provide fulltime vested police officers the option to purchase up to five years of their previous part-time or full-time employment for pension benefit purposes. This bill passed the Senate on June 15 and awaits consideration by the House Local Government Committee.
- Senate Bill 775 introduced by Senator Camera Bartolotta, would amend the Workers' Compensation Law lowering the threshold for first responders to receive a benefit for a posttraumatic stress injury (PTSI). This bill awaits second consideration in the Senate.
- 3. House Bill 2286 introduced by Representative Tracy Pennycuick, would amend the Municipalities Planning Code mandating that municipalities allow temporary low-impact homebased businesses by right in residentially zoned districts during an emergency declaration or natural disaster. Any local permitting process would be prohibited; the business owner would only be responsible for providing the municipality with written notice of intent to relocate a business to their residence. This bill awaits second consideration in the House.

The League opposes these three bills as written and will continue to work with the General Assembly to improve the legislation.

An e-bike is a bicycle equipped with an electric motor that assists the rider when they are pedaling. **Comments are due by August 31**.
