





Municipalities of nearly all sizes responded.





How does your municipality match up or differ?


Anticipated Population Trends

In the next 10 years, about half of respondents expect their populations to increase. Only 7% anticipate a decrease in population.




Anticipated concerns: Top ten for the next ten years.

Highest on the list are aging infrastructure, attracting and retaining businesses, and jobs and economic growth.



Upgrading or replacing essential public safety infrastructure.	67%	22%	11%
Implementing new training programs for law enforcement and other public safety personnel.	66%	22%	12%
Engaging in inter-municipal cooperation to provide police, fire or emergency medical services.	49%	30%	22%
Investing in prevention and intervention programs to reduce criminal activity.	47%	26%	28%
Adding community service staff or programs (e.g., mental health outreach).	21%	25%	53%

Community Development & Infrastructure

Most municipalities are actively addressing infrastructure projects and environmental concerns. More than half are investing in economic development.

Undertaking major infrastructure projects (e.g., roads, bridges, storm water)	84%	13%	3%
Enhancing water, air quality, recycling, or other environmental concerns.	70%	22%	9%
Investing in economic development to build and sustain a robust local economy.	58%	27%	15%
Addressing affordable housing.	32%	34%	35%
Working to ensure your community has broadband access.	30%	31%	38%

Municipal Finance

Finding ways to share costs fairly and regional problem-solving are the top current and planned actions. More than half also view finance laws as a priority.

Determining ways to share service costs across all users fairly (e.g. public safety, public infrastructure)	54%	29%	17%
Employing regional problem-solving to spread costs and serve constituents.	43%	38%	19%
Advocating for updates to municipal finance laws and practices to prevent municipal distress.	23%	35%	42%
Addressing the impact of tax-exempt properties.	17%	27%	56%

Local Government Modernization

Three quarters are focused on training and the majority are expanding technology use, investing in cyber security, and collaborating with community partners.

Ensuring local officials and staff receive training.	76%	19%	4%
Expanding the use of technology to enhance operations and constituent services.	68%	28%	4%
Investing in cybersecurity solutions.	60%	23%	17%
Collaborating with community partners to solve problems (e.g., businesses, universities).	55%	32%	13%

Transparency & Collaboration

Most municipalities are actively working to ensure open and accessible government and collaborating with state lawmakers and neighboring governments.

Adopting mechanisms that ensure open and accessible government.	85%	12%	4%
Establishing and maintaining productive partnerships with state lawmakers and officials.	85%	11%	4%
Establishing and maintaining productive partnerships with contiguous municipalities and your county.	78%	20%	2%

Equity & Civic Engagement

More than three quarters of municipalities are involving residents. Nearly two-thirds are fostering connections between diverse residents and embedding diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) in policies and operations.

Actively involving residents in the decisions and activities of your municipality.	82%	14%	4%
Helping build relationships and connections among residents from diverse ethnic, cultural, religious, socioeconomic groups.	64%	27%	9%
Embedding DEI as core principles in your community's policies and operations.	63%	27%	10%
Building awareness and understanding among residents regarding civic issues, rights, and responsibilities.	59%	30%	12%




Our 10-Year vision will articulate what municipal leaders view as essential to ensuring strong, healthy, vibrant municipalities throughout Pennsylvania.
