2022 Adopted Resolutions

The League is a member-driven organization relying on member municipalities to help develop policies that meet the present needs of local government. Our annual <u>resolutions process</u> provides every League member with the opportunity to participate in, and shape, The League's legislative agenda.

During The League's Municipal Leadership Summit, the voting delegates for the Resolutions Committee and Annual Business Meeting met for a final discussion and vote on the proposed 2022 Resolutions. All 12 resolutions were adopted and will be integrated into the 2023 Policy Statement.

<u>NLC Federal Advocacy Newsletter – Treasury Help Center for SLFRF Recipients Shutting Down</u> – Last week, the Department of Treasury announced their assistance to local governments with questions about the complex rules and requirements of the American Rescue Plan Act's State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program would be dramatically scaled back starting Monday, October 17.
