Take Action to Push Local Use of Radar Forward

Senate Bill 459 authorizing the local use of radar bill has been stalled in the Senate Appropriations Committee for over seven months. Now is the time to put pressure on the Senate to pass Senate Bill 459 before the end of the year.

With both the increase of speed-related fatalities in Pennsylvania and the dwindling number of non-radar speed timing devices, a public safety crisis looms over the commonwealth. It is time to trust municipal police with radar.

Please call or email your Senator today and ask that they encourage Senate Leadership to move Senate Bill 459 out of the Appropriations Committee and to the Floor for a final vote.

Here are the talking points to use.

- · Local use of radar is a public safety measure.
- · Pennsylvania is the only state that does not allow for the local use of radar.
- According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's 2021 crash data:
 - the total number of fatalities increased in Pennsylvania by 9% from 2020 to 2021;
 - of the 1,230 total fatalities, 500 are speed-related fatalities, making up around 41% of all traffic fatalities in Pennsylvania; and
 - Pennsylvania ranks third, behind California and Texas, for the most speed-related deaths and third for the highest percentage of speed related fatalities in 2021.
- In addition to the increase of speed-related fatalities, the non-radar speed timing devices and technology available to local police are becoming more and more obsolete.
 - Companies producing these devices are going out of business or ceasing production, as there is very little demand for these products outside of Pennsylvania.
- With an increase in speed-related fatalities and a decline in local law enforcement access to nonradar speed timing devices, it is critical now more than ever to authorize local use of radar.

Newly Elected Official Affidavits of Residency

Prior to taking the Oath of Office, each newly elected official in a third class city, borough, or first class township must present a signed affidavit to the city clerk, secretary or manager attesting to continuous residency for one year preceding the individual's election. This affidavit is a qualification for office.

Please see the following sections of the codes:

- <u>Section 11001</u> of the Third Class City Code
- Section 501 of the First Class Township Code
- Section 801 and Section 901 of the Borough Code

Each municipality should reach out to its newly elected officials and provide notice of this requirement well in advance of January's swearing-in ceremonies. <u>Click here</u> for a sample residency affidavit. Your solicitor should approve the affidavit prior to its use.

Solar Webinar for Municipalities — Join us on Friday, November 17 at 12:00 p.m. for an enlightening discussion on Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) and its potential for Pennsylvania boroughs to boost solar initiatives in their communities.

Community Choice Aggregation: Boroughs are Ready!

ARPA Obligation Deadline is Around the Corner — The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) provided municipalities with a long runway to obligate the allocated funds under the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program. If a municipality has not obligated its ARPA SLFRF funds by the end of 2024, they will have to return the funds to Treasury.

The National Civic League applications are now open for the 2024 <u>All-America City Award</u> — This award honors communities that harness the power of civic engagement to effectively tackle local challenges. The deadline for optional letters of intent to apply is December 14, 2023, final applications must be submitted by February 13, 2024. In March 2024, we'll announce the top 20 finalists who will convene in Denver, CO from June 7-9, 2024.

Take a look at Protect Local Waterways which supports and informs decision-making by local government leaders across the Chesapeake Bay watershed, showing elected officials how their actions to protect and restore the environment can support education, economic development, public health and safety, and infrastructure. It was developed in coordination with the Local Leadership Workgroup.
