Program Overview & Designation Levels

- Free and voluntary online recognition program with integrated resources
- For municipalities throughout the commonwealth
- Designation level determined using:
 - Percentage of points based on number of employees
 - Completion of a set of required actions specific to each level
- 127 currently certified
- 4 million people











CERTIFICATION TIMELINE

- There is no deadline to participate
- Nov 20th deadline for grant of up to \$3,000 per municipality
 (Armstrong, Butler, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence and Washington counties)
- Certifications expire and must be updated every three years.
